## Half Say They Disapprove of National Day of Remembrance and Action on Islamophobia

## Only one-sixth approve

Toronto, January 26th - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum PollTM among 1408 Canadian voters, half (BTM2: 49\%) say they would disapprove of a national day of remembrance and action on Islamophobia, with almost 4 in 10 (39\%) saying they strongly disapprove.

One-sixth (TOP2: 17\%) say they would approve of such a day, but few just under 1 in 10 ( $7 \%$ ) say they strongly approve.

One-quarter (26\%) say they neither approve nor disapprove, and about 1 in 10 (7\%) say they do not know.

Respondents most likely to say they disapprove (BTM2) include those aged 55-64 ( $57 \%$ ), males ( $59 \%$ ), the most wealthy ( $59 \%$ ), living in the prairies ( $\mathrm{MB} / \mathrm{SK}$ ) ( $57 \%$ ) or Alberta (55\%), with a college/university degree (51\%) or post-graduate degree ( $52 \%$ ) and supporting the Conservatives (69\%).

Respondents most likely to say they approve (TOP2) include those aged 34 and younger (27\%), the least wealthy (26\%), and supporters of the Liberals ( $28 \%$ ) or NDP (26\%).
"Currently there is a high level of opposition to a National Islamophobia day, with most of those saying they disapprove doing so strongly," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research.

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## Methodology

The Forum PollTM was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1408 randomly selected Canadian Voters. The poll was conducted January 22-24, 2017.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3\%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
