Purpose

This report is being submitted to Council to inform them of an internship that the City of Quesnel has secured from April-September 2021.

Summary

The City of Quesnel's Forestry Initiatives Program has been successful in our application to the Mathematics of Information Technology and Complex Systems Program (MiTACS) for hosting an intern from UBC. The intern will spend 6 months in total (2 of those months living in Quesnel) helping us understand how can interactions within the Quesnel forestry network can bring new and innovative opportunities to our community.

Their lead professor Dr. Jeff Sayer hoped that they could return to the area to pursue their Vibrant Forest Landscapes research on small and medium forestry enterprises. Now, through the funding from MiTACS with assistance from the Rural Dividend Fund, we can begin this important research into how the interactions within the Quesnel forestry network can bring new and innovative opportunities to our community.
