## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the governance of the Public Utility Commission of
- 3 Texas, the Office of Public Utility Counsel, and an independent
- 4 organization certified to manage a power region.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 12.052(a), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) The governor shall designate a commissioner as the
- 9 presiding officer. The commissioner designated as the presiding
- 10 officer must be a resident of this state.
- SECTION 2. Section 13.022(a), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 (a) The counsellor must:
- 14 (1) be licensed to practice law in this state and a
- 15 resident of this state;
- 16 (2) have demonstrated a strong commitment to and
- 17 involvement in efforts to safeguard the rights of the public; and
- 18 (3) possess the knowledge and experience necessary to
- 19 practice effectively in utility proceedings.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.151, Utilities Code, is amended by
- 21 amending Subsections (g) and (g-1) and adding Subsections (g-2),
- 22 (g-3), (g-4), and (g-5) to read as follows:
- 23 (g) To maintain certification as an independent
- 24 organization under this section, an organization's governing body

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- 1 must be composed of persons specified by this section and selected
- 2 in accordance with formal bylaws or protocols of the organization.
- 3 The bylaws or protocols must be approved by the commission and must
- 4 reflect the input of the commission. The bylaws must specify the
- 5 process by which appropriate stakeholders elect members [and, for
- 6 unaffiliated members, prescribe professional qualifications for
- 7 selection as a member. The bylaws must require the use of a
- 8 professional search firm to identify candidates for membership of
- 9  $\frac{\text{unaffiliated members}}{\text{members}}$ ]. The process must allow for commission input
- 10 in identifying candidates. The governing body must be composed of:
- 11 (1) the chairman of the commission as an ex officio
- 12 nonvoting member;
- 13 (2) the counsellor as an ex officio voting member
- 14 representing residential and small commercial consumer interests;
- 15 (3) the chief executive officer of the independent
- 16 organization as an ex officio voting member;
- 17 (4) six market participants elected by their
- 18 respective market segments to serve one-year terms, with:
- 19 (A) one representing independent generators;
- 20 (B) one representing investor-owned utilities;
- 21 (C) one representing power marketers;
- (D) one representing retail electric providers;
- (E) one representing municipally owned
- 24 utilities; and
- 25 (F) one representing electric cooperatives;
- 26 (5) one member representing industrial consumer
- 27 interests and elected by the industrial consumer market segment to

- 1 serve a one-year term;
- 2 (6) one member representing large commercial consumer
- 3 interests selected in accordance with the bylaws to serve a
- 4 one-year term; [and]
- 5 (7) three members appointed by the governor, at least
- 6 one of whom must represent residential consumer interests;
- 7 (8) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 8 and
- 9 (9) one member appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 10 representatives [five members unaffiliated with any market segment
- 11 and selected by the other members of the governing body to serve
- 12 three-year terms].
- 13 (g-1) The governor shall designate the presiding officer of
- 14 the independent organization's governing body [must be one of the
- 15 members described by Subsection (g)(7)].
- 16 (g-2) Members of the governing body of an independent
- 17 organization certified under this section appointed under
- 18 Subsections (g)(7), (8), and (9) serve staggered terms of two
- 19 years, with three members' terms expiring February 1 of each
- 20 odd-numbered year and two members' terms expiring February 1 of
- 21 <u>each even-numbered year.</u> Not later than the 30th day after the date
- 22 <u>a member of the governing body's term expires, the appropriate</u>
- 23 appointing authority shall appoint a replacement in the same manner
- 24 as the original appointment. If a vacancy occurs on the governing
- 25 body, the appropriate appointing authority shall appoint a
- 26 successor in the same manner as the original appointment to serve
- 27 for the remainder of the unexpired term. The appropriate

- 1 appointing authority shall appoint the successor not later than the
- 2 30th day after the date the vacancy occurs.
- 3 (g-3) To qualify as a member of the governing body under
- 4 Subsection (g)(4), (5), (6), (7), (8), or (9), a person must be a
- 5 resident of this state.
- 6 (g-4) To maintain certification as an independent
- 7 organization under this section, an organization's chief executive
- 8 officer must be a resident of this state.
- 9 (g-5) A member of the governing body is not entitled to
- 10 compensation, but is entitled to reimbursement for travel and other
- 11 necessary expenses related to the activities of the independent
- 12 organization as provided by the General Appropriations Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 14 date of this Act, the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of
- 15 the house of representatives shall comply with Section 39.151,
- 16 Utilities Code, as amended by this Act, by appointing members to the
- 17 governing body of an independent organization certified under
- 18 Section 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of
- 19 Texas before September 1, 2021. To establish staggered terms, the
- 20 governor shall designate three initial appointees to serve terms
- 21 expiring February 1 of the next odd-numbered year and two initial
- 22 appointees to serve terms expiring February 1 of the next
- 23 even-numbered year.
- 24 (b) An independent organization certified under Section
- 25 39.151, Utilities Code, by the Public Utility Commission of Texas
- 26 before September 1, 2021, shall ensure that the chief executive
- 27 officer of the organization is a resident of this state as soon as

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- 1 practicable, but not later than September 1, 2022.
- 2 (c) After September 1, 2022, the Public Utility Commission
- 3 of Texas may decertify an independent organization whose governing
- 4 body or chief executive officer does not comply with Section
- 5 39.151, Utilities Code, as amended by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
