

January 2023

- PSEF started the year by quickly filling 173 spots for Summer Sail Camp. Some campers attended more than 1 week, so there were 152 unique campers.
- Sail Camp was led by 6 level one instructors and 5 camp counselors.
- In July the J22 fleet loaned it's five boats for a week of keel boat training. Thank you J22 fleet!
- PSEF also held adult Learn-To-Sail classes in the Spring, Summer, and Fall, with a total of 29 students.
- In September, the Juniors started racing on Sundays alongside the PYC One-Design fleets.
- Juniors raced in Opti's, Fusions and Club 420's. Thanks to Steve Sherman and Ed Buiel for overseeing the Junior Racing Program.
- In October PSEF elected a new president, PYC member Andrew Postell.
- Megan Cline, daughter of PYC's Scott Cline, will be the Sail Camp Director in training in 2023 and Sail Camp Director in 2024. Megan is a former Sail Camp student, coach, and counselor.
- Going forward, PYC and PSEF are looking into possible changes that may help reduce insurance costs for both organizations.

Buildings and Grounds: Projects completed during 2022

Many, many thanks to the approximately 103+ (57-60%) associate & family members who volunteered to help with the Spring or Fall Clean-up, or completed tasks on the "To Do On Your Own Time" list, or shoveled and raked gravel or hauled mulch! Thanks to those who donated their time, materials and/or equipment! Thanks to the unsung members who saw maintenance issues and immediately took care of the situation, or at least contacted me! In addition to ongoing upkeep and general maintenance, together we completed many special projects!

Kitchen Upgrade - Phase I- 3 new commercial grade kitchen appliances installed:

- 6 burner stove
- convection oven (to be used for club sanctioned events only)
- 2 door reach-in refrigerator
- warming oven
- upgraded power source to accommodate new appliances (thanks David Bergevin and Tom Clark)

Grounds:

- added tons of gravel to parking lots and pathways to docks (thanks to Chris Griffin volunteering with a front loader tractor)
- trimmed back branches hanging over the road to launch ramp that were interfering with mast wind indicators, removed heavy logs, cut brush way back (thanks to Fall Workday volunteers and Alex Rosser)
- thoroughly cleaned inside of clubhouse and removed many leaves from the property; replenished firewood pile by cutting up fallen wood (thanks to Spring Workday volunteers)
- installed brighter lighting in "J lot" storage container (thanks David Bergevin and Tom Clark)

Clubhouse:

- added 6' fan to patio over seating area (parking side of clubhouse)
- increased the number of timers on overhead lighting (thanks to David Bergevin)
- replaced vinyl trim in overhead doors where tall heat lamp caused warping
- repaired leak in roof
- reinforced inside walls of fireplaces with firebrick (thanks to Ken Pickering); fires must remain small; be gentle with the fire poker

Property Security and Safety:

 added signage and very minimal surveillance to areas where theft has occurred and to deter unauthorized nonmembers from entering the property through the main gate

Suggested Future Projects for 2023 include:

- Kitchen Upgrade Phase II purchase and install commercial dishwasher with 3 compartment sink; add additional storage (stainless tables with drawers & dry storage cabinet/additional pantry shelving; add addition dish cart and server cart
- replace hand rails at top of swim dock stairs
- pave or install pavers between base of deck steps and landing of swim dock
- · install non-slip steps leading from "J-lot" to clubhouse
- install proper venting for convection oven
- address parking lot-runoff issues
- add lighting to main clubhouse parking lot
- improve ventilation in men's shower area
- add two 30AMP RV connection points in "J" lot
- · install noise abatement acoustical panels / install wireless PA system
- repair sheetrock (areas where roof leaked)
- replace lattice under clubhouse front porch
- Spring Work Day (scheduled for March 4, 2023)
- Fall Work Day (scheduled for November 12, 2023)


