Methodology

This research was conducted by Dittman Research for the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services. During the period November 24-25, 2020, we interviewed 406 Alaskan residents, age 18 and older, via live interviewer telephone survey. Half of respondents (50%) were interviewed on their cell phone. The survey featured a probability sample and has a margin of error of +/- 4.9% at a 95% confidence interval. Interviews were fielded based on the geographic distribution of Alaskans. Region-level interview quotas by age and gender were used to ensure a representative sample of Alaskans was achieved. The data required minimal weighting to match the demographic characteristics of Alaskans with respect to gender, political party and region.
