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Powahay Klondike Derby Dedicated in Memory of Matthew Joseph Dooley, Eagle Scout Troop 20 Wilton



Matthew Joseph Dooley passed away on Wednesday, Jan. 5, at the age of 16, at home in his parents' arms after fighting an aggressive glioblastoma brain tumor. Matt was born on April 21, 2005, the son of Michael and Jane Dooley. He leaves behind his sisters Devon and Stacia Dooley, grandmother Patricia Dooley, and uncles David Brown (Doreen) and Patrick Dooley (Scott). He was predeceased by his grandfather, John Dooley, and grandparents Edward and Susan Brown. Matt also leaves behind numerous other relatives and friends who loved him very much.

Matt had a huge love of sports. He played baseball, football, squash, tennis, and golf. He was also a fan

of F1 and endurance car racing, and he fulfilled his dream of attending The 24 Hours of Le Mans race in France this past summer. Additionally, in fifth grade, Matt and his father made it a goal to visit all 30 major league baseball stadiums and, despite his illness and the Covid pandemic, they reached their goal in September.

Matt had a genuine passion for learning and he loved being a student at Trinity-Pawling School, where he was a junior. He made it a priority to attend school whenever he could between treatments, and you would rarely see him not wearing some sort of school swag. During his sophomore year, he received the school's Wells Award for his outstanding performance and character. The family is beyond grateful to the entire Trinity-Pawling School Family for the overwhelming support given to Matt and

our family.

Matt's outlook and attitude truly reflected what an inspirational young man he was. Matt was always looking at the positive side of any situation, no matter how tough things got, and it served him well throughout his cancer journey. He always persevered and considered others before himself and he never lost his sense of humor. Even when the tumor had taken away the use of his left side, he focused on what he could do, never what he could not do. This determination is reflected in him recently achieving his Eagle Scout rank with Troop 20 after being involved in scouting since the first grade.

We are grateful for the gift of Matt's life and the special memories that we celebrate. Matt modeled how to live with enthusiasm and optimism, and those who knew him were touched by his empathetic, kind, thoughtful, and non-judgmental nature, as well as his sincere love of life. Matt will also be remembered for his endearing love of his dog, Sadie, and cats, Romeo and Lucifer. Matt's soulful smile will never be forgotten and his incredible hugs will be sorely missed.

Gone Home! Orlando Busino Scout Life Cartoonist






In 2022, Connecticut Yankee Council is launching a reimagined Development strategy to both increase and diversify our sources of revenues and financial support.

A key initiative is to raise awareness of our program outside our traditional donor and sponsor base and to increase support from individuals, businesses and non-profits who are passionate about and aligned with our mission.

In order to support the Council Development Committee strategy, each District was invited to create a Development Committee in order to assist with this effort, which Powahay District achieved at our annual meeting in December.

In terms of Friends of Scouting (FOS), there will be an in-person FOS Kickoff Breakfast on Saturday morning, February 26, at the Marriott Trumbull. There will be no charge to attend however attendees will be expected to make their annual FOS donation at that time.

In addition, there will not be any FOS unit presentations this year. In 2022, the Family FOS campaign will be via mail and online only.

Also, the District Good Scout Award Dinners are being replaced with two table host events with keynote speakers, one targeting Fairfield County and one targeting Greater New Haven, both to be held in April or May. Details are forthcoming.

And finally, there will be several experiential special events (Women in Leadership Lunch, Night at Blackrock, a celebrity golf outing, an upgraded sporting clays shooting event, etc) that will be held later in the year to raise additional fundraising dollars.

More details on all to be announced in the coming weeks after the Connecticut Yankee Council Executive Board annual meeting.

Advancement News Chet Wickett District Advancement Chairman

As we know by now, a Scout must complete all Eagle Scout requirements before the age of 18. Many Scouts finish all the requirements just before their 18th birthday. We get emails and calls concerned that this Scout is not having an Eagle Scout board of review before the age of 18. Please remember that as long as the Scout has all the requirements completed before the age of 18 and importantly, the Scoutmaster Conference was held and signed off on before the age of 18, the Eagle Scout board can be held after their 18th birthday. If a Scout has completed their 6 months in a position of responsibility; 21 merit badges and the required Eagle Scout service project before the age of 18, it is important to know that the Scoutmaster Conference date on the Eagle application must be BEFORE the age of 18. The other signatures on the return can be after the birthday. Again, the board of review can be held after the Scout reaches 18.

You need to know! COVID modifications for rank requirements and merit badge requirements to be rolled back. The BSA's top priority has been the health and safety of all youth participating in BSA programs. In 2020,

the BSA instituted several modifications to rank requirements and merit badge requirements ("advancement modifications") to accommodate activity restrictions necessitated by COVID-19. Effective March 01, 2022, those modifications will be removed, and the standard rules for advancement and merit badges will again become effective. All temporary changes made to Scouts BSA advancement requirements to address the COVID-19 pandemic will expire, and there will be a return to the standard rules for Scouts BSA advancement. This includes deferment of some swimming requirements for First and Second class, virtual activities for Tenderfoot, Second and First Class, and requirement 9b of the Camping merit badge.

In the Powahay District section on the council website, look for "Advancement" and you will find instructions how to provide the advancement committee the Eagle Scout work papers virtually. These instructions are now being used by all districts. A Scout that completes their proposal and gets signatures can send "file" as an attachment to an email. The attachment would include drawings, photos, etc. A separate file with signatures can be provided. Again, complete instructions are on this site. Any questions or concerns, please contact Chester Wickett. So now a Scout can provide paperwork.

As we now know, National has issued a new merit badge which is Citizen of Society. We need good listener merit badge counselors. This badge is currently an "optional" merit badge but as of July 1, 2022, this new badge will be Eagle required. Please know that there is no merit badge pamphlet. The requirements are online. We understand that National is updating a few of the requirements. Furthermore, National has provided quidance as to their recommendation who best fits as a counselor for this badge. Preference is for teachers, professors, inclusion facilitators, human resource professionals, clergy, counseling professionals and social workers. The role of the merit badge counselor is to guide Scouts on their journey of self-discovery and facilitate important discussions about the diverse world we live in. Counselors should not advocate for a particular point of view; instead, they will determine whether that Scout's response is based on a good faith effort and rooted in the values of the Scout Oath and Scout Law, Counselors must also adhere to the BSA Code of Conduct and Youth Protection Guidelines in all interactions with youth. To be a counselor, the adult must submit the standard merit badge information form and state why they qualify to be a counselor. Furthermore, the adult must take the 30-minute online training entitled "Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in Scouting" - Volunteer Training. If the adult qualifies, they will receive the merit badge counselor guide.

And the role of the parents? It's ultimately up to the parents/guardians and Scouts to determine the right level of involvement. Merit badge counselors will serve as a resource to Scouts and parents

- → Hold the rank of Scouts BSA First Class, Venturing Discovery, or Sea Scout Ordinary.
- → Additionally, a unit must have 50% of its registered members present to conduct an election. Our visitation season will be open until Owaneco Day (3/13), so please make sure to register if you are interested in an election or visitation.

Unit leaders will be receiving emails directly to sign up for an OA visitation, please be sure to sign up ASAP.


