- In July, the new curate, Ignacio Gama, will begin his ministry here.
- What we have learned over our time of Jubilee ("perfection") and over the pandemic time
- The theme of this Lenten season is "Restore." We will be led in a study of the Psalms.
- This is a turning point for our parish, community and society. We need to take stock of and reconnect with the gifts of the church, including recommitting to regular worship.
- Opportunities
 - o Preschool/MDO
 - Lisa has taken on the task of discernment and exploration for the new preschool/MDO, with the help of our intern, Lily. Plant and market feasibility studies are to be done and findings presented on late summer or early fall. The goal is to take registrations starting in early 2023.
 - This presents an opportunity to look at the campus and community through the eyes of our youngest members, and to explore the needs of kids and parents in the community.
 - Five acres of land in Wylie was given to Epiphany for development. We are beginning a women's Bible study in Wylie with a men's Bible study to come.
 - o In due time other opportunities to develop our community should come our way and we will explore them.
 - Questions
 - What is our vision? The answer to this will come through community.
 - Are folks leaving Epiphany? The answer to this is no, but we want to reach people outside Epiphany.
 - Who will be our priests and staff? This is unknown but it will be gratifying to explore.

SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

This year was one of many blessings for Epiphany, as we fully returned to post-pandemic worship and ministries. We welcomed back many familiar faces and welcomed in many new ones. It was also our 50th anniversary, and we celebrated the Jubilee with a special worship service in January and a banquet in May.

I have been honored and privileged to serve as your Senior Warden this past year, which has been one of renewal, recommitment, and growth for both the church and us as individuals. Through it all, our parish has been so blessed for the faithful, energetic (!), and Spirit-filled leadership of Mother Betsy Randall. We ended 2022 with news of her departure, as she has accepted a call to be Canon to the Ordinary for the Diocese of Oklahoma. We will miss her dearly, but know that God has great plans for her work in our neighbor to the north.

We can see now that God was preparing Epiphany for Mother Betsy's departure this year by building up a strong cadre of clergy who can continue after she leaves. Early in the year, our beloved Canon David Petrash retired and has been enjoying some well-earned rest and time with family. He is still a regular in the pews and at the pulpit, and we are grateful for his kind presence. Father Chris Stephen was brought on staff this year, and serves faithfully at both English and Hindi-Urdu services. We welcomed Deacon Ignacio Gama as our curate, and he was ordained as Father Gama in a wonderful ceremony in November. Just a few weeks later, our own David Gibson was ordained as a Deacon at St. Matthew's Cathedral. Rounding out our clergy power team is retired Canon Neal Michell, who will serve as Interim Rector in 2023. Albert Cheng continues to shepherd the Khmer language service, and Sarah Jo Skinner preaches regularly (and beautifully!) as our Director of Discipleship and Family Ministry.

We are so grateful for the hardworking and dedicated staff who keep this church running. In addition to those listed above, we thank Director of Music Corey Chandler; Parish Administrator Lisa Farrell; Director of Youth, College, and Young Adult Ministry Margaret Kinnett; Children's Music Coordinator Temple Taylor; Nursery Coordinator Candace Allen; Bookkeeper Fely Eichenberger; Sexton George Murphy; nursery staff Kathi Simmons, Kay McGee, Hannah Bauer, Venna John, and Kennedy Scott. We also want to thank Katie Roche, who stepped in for Youth, College, and Young Adult Ministries when Margaret was on maternity leave.

The vestry's calendar was full of the usual votes related to facilities, budgets, and approvals of financials. But perhaps our most significant vote was the approval to proceed with a Parents' Day Out/preschool program starting in Fall 2023. An advisory committee did an extensive feasibility study, physical plant study, neighborhood market study, and budget evaluation, as well as consultations with several other preschool directors in the area. Upon vestry approval, they ran a national search for the Director and chose a familiar face-our own Sarah Jo Skinner. Sarah Jo will continue to serve as the Director of Christian Education for the church, as well as the Director of the Epiphany School.

I want to thank the vestry for their hard work over the past year, as we navigated the tail end of the pandemic, budget pressures, and at the end of the year, the need to call an Interim rector. In particular, I want to thank outgoing Junior Warden Mike Morrison for keeping a close eye on our facilities and staying on top of the many repairs that happen with a physical plant as large as ours. I also want to thank the other two outgoing vestry members–Frank Fuller and Dan Weston–for your prayerful discernment of the decisions before us, and for being such an encouragement to me personally. We are excited to welcome incoming vestry members Chris

Bailey, Bob McLendon, Margie Roche, and Becky Umstead. I also want to thank Curtis Bowden, our treasurer, for tireless service. The job of a treasurer is constant, and Curtis does it with care, thoughtfulness, and great attention to detail.

God continues to bless Epiphany through the generosity of our members, and this year's stewardship season garnered the highest pledges yet. We give thanks to God for the ways those funds can support the furthering of the Kingdom here on Earth. We are especially grateful to the Stewardship Committee, led by John Gibson. The Stewardship campaign this year, entitled Recognizing Abundance, encouraged us to recognize the innumerable ways God has blessed us spiritually, physically, and financially.

This coming year will be a seminal one as we call a new Rector. Please pray for God's guidance as we discern the next leader who will continue our commitment to be "Servants for God, Our Parish, and the Community."

JUNIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

We have been blessed by the addition of a sexton to the Epiphany Staff. George Murphy, who is also a new member of the church, was hired in May of 2022. He is a retired master carpenter and has made many repairs and improvements to our buildings and the entire campus.

Some of those improvements include:

Gift Shop/Bookstore Renovation

- Converted to our new Food Bag Ministry Office Canon David Petrash will be officing in this location and overseeing that ministry
- Renovation to this area included replacing all conduit and wiring, repaired front door and sheetrock, repainted ceiling and walls, refinished trim and windows

Kitchen Renovation

- Installed new LED lighting
- New paint in a lighter color to increase visibility
- Deep cleaning and organization twice a month
- Stove has been calibrated, repairs to burners, and a stop valve for the gas line installed

Metal Refurbishing and Painting

- Cross on South side of church
- Aluminum windows in breezeway
- Gutters and downspouts
- Doors and siding on Founders Hall leading out to courtyard

Servants Hall and Founders Hall

- Repaired mountings for the hanging lights
- Repaired emergency egress lighting in the staircase
- Installed a hardwire network cable to the projector

In addition to the ongoing repairs several projects have been completed on the campus. These include:

- Gazebo for the Epiphany Garden Area
- New Fence for the Playground
- Converted the old priest sacristy to an additional workspace for the flower guild
- New carpeting in choir loft stairwell
- Shrubbery Replacement
- Installation of several new HVAC systems
- Repair of all leaking gas lines
- Irrigation and building water leak repairs
