Halloween is approaching and we want to take the time to share some topics to consider as you prepare for Fall Parties. Because not all students and their families based on culture, religious or other reasons celebrate Halloween, we at WM will need to create an environment that is inclusive to all students. With that said, we need your help. Regarding costumes, we want all students and staff to feel safe and comfortable. This means that dressing up to depict a race or culture other than one's own, or a historically or currently oppressive figure, is harmful. Further, doing so perpetuates stereotypes, cultural appropriation, discrimination, and insensitivity. Focus on costuming linked to a specific character, not general looks that have meaning to oftenmarginalized groups of people. Some examples to avoid are the mustache and poncho combo, Native American headdresses, kimonos and grass skirts with a coconut top, famous Disney characters such as Moana, Pocahontas, Tiana etc. The key here is for students to not dress up as any member of a culture that isn't their own. Cultures and races are not, and should never be considered, costumes. For anyone who participates in Fall festivities by dressing up, please remember that this day and every day should be one that is fun, inclusive, and respectful of the diversity that we have in our school. Please know that dressing up is optional.

If you are sending treats to school or Fall Parties, please be sure to include enough for all students in the class. *It is extremely important to remember*that all treats should be individually wrapped.

Please avoid cupcakes, cookies, cake, loose bags of candy like Skittles, M&Ms etc.



In accordance with the Districts Covid Handbook https://www.nsd.org/covid19/protocols, It is our highest priority to maintain safety at all times to avoid possible exposure and spread of COVID 19. At the beginning of the school year, we started off with all students in zones during recess with their classroom. We determined we would revisit this after the first month of school. After feedback from students and parents, we have determined that moving forward beginning next Monday, October 18th, we will be modifying our recess. Student zones will now be by grade level and not by class. This shift in zones allows students more areas to play during recess in addition to supporting students' social emotional needs during this time, while still having safety measures in place.



Picture retake day will be Thursday November 4th. This day is mainly for students that were absent on our original picture day in September. Teachers will have a list of who was absent and will make sure those students get their pictures taken.

For the students that want their picture re-done for another reason will need to let their teacher know and make sure they have their original picture pack with them for the retake picture.

School News



We are excited to welcome volunteers back to campus this year in support of our staff and students. All volunteers in the Northshore School District are able to complete their volunteer application and background check online. Family members of students and community members who volunteer at more than one school will only need to complete the application once a year. Volunteers can learn more and complete an online application here. Follow the Application Process (School and District Volunteers), filling out Steps 1-4. We are committed to providing a safe work environment for employees & students. All volunteers must:

- Frequent handwashing, social distancing and wearing mask while on campus.
- Stay home when sick or having been in close contact with a person with COVID-19.
- In order to assist with contract tracing, all volunteering must be <u>prearranged</u> with your classroom teacher.
- All volunteers must check-in and check-out at the front office upon arrival and leaving the school grounds.

Once you are approved, you and your classroom teacher will be notified by the Woodmoor Office.



This is a reminder that the deadline to submit the Permission to Withhold Student Directory Info rmation form is Friday, Oct. 15, 2021. If you wish to submit this form do so on our website or by downloading the PDF, signing it and returning it to your school's main office. On the form, you will find three choices as to how you can control how your student's information is shared. Again, if you wish to complete this form you must do so no later than Oct. 15. Forms will be accepted after the deadline, but the District cannot be responsible for the release of Directory Information if the Permission to Withhold Student Directory Info rmation form is received after the October 15 deadline of the current school year.

Federal law prohibits school districts from releasing information found in student files without parent/guardian permission, except for what is termed Directory Information. You can learn more about what our district releases by visiting our webpage. The District does not release Directory Information for commercial or fundraising purposes but does release this information when there is a legitimate educational purpose for doing so.

If you completed this form this school year on ParentVUE and submitted it to your school already, no additional action is required. Your form will remain on file for this school year.



If a person has one or more of these symptoms:









Deaf or hard of hearing customers, please call 711 (Washington Relay) or email civil.rights@doh.wa.gov. *Close contact: Someone who was within 6 feet of a COVID-19 positive person for a total of 15 minutes or more within 24 hours during the case's contagious period. In a K-12 indoor/outdoor classroom, the close contact definition excludes students who were at least three feet away from an infectious student when both students were consistently and correctly wearing masks. Please see the COVID-19 Contact Tracing Is for additional information. The definition of a close contact may vary in some situations. The local health department makes the ultimate determination of a close contact during its investigation, but may delegate this decision if appropriate


Identify and Care for Close Contacts at School

Virtual Office

COVID Feelings

While we are back to in-person school, students are still processing a lot of changes. In particular, the quarantine process this year means that students will sometimes have to learn from home unexpectedly. This can bring up a lot of complicated feelings for kids, and adults too. I created this video here to talk about the different feelings students might experience, and what they can do to process those feelings.

Bullying Prevention Month

The month of October is Bullying Prevention Month. This is a great time to remind your students of a few key ways they can help prevent bullying:

- Recognize: It is important to help students recognize what bullying is. Bullying is when one person or a group of people hurt or scare someone repeatedly without stopping. Bullying can include physical aggression such as hitting or kicking as well as emotional aggression in the form of teasing, exclusion, or threats.
- **Report:** Your student may recognize that they are being bullied, or that someone else is being bullied. Once they know that bullying is happening, it is important that they reach out to an adult to tell them what is happening. Help your child understand the trusted adults they can talk to, including you, their teacher, and other staff at school.
- **Refuse:** With the support of trusted adults, students are in a better position to stand up to bullying. You can help them practice assertive behavior, such as saying, "Stop. This is bullying and it is not okay" Help students remember that if they see bullying happen to others, they also have the power to stand up and stop it.


