INTRODUCING...

The Centre for Innovation in Peer Support broke new ground in 2021 with the introduction of several new programs and opportunities for community partners.

We launched our new Virtual Learning Centre & Resource Hub regularly updated with educational toolkits, documents and videos. These offerings support the practice and implementation of peer support within Ontario

We piloted a NEW comprehensive Peer Support Core Competencies Training program with 18 youth representing The New Mentality, a program of Children's Mental Health Ontario; and 20 adult peer support workers from the Krasman Centre. Our PSCC Training runs quarterly, is offered completely virtually, free of charge, and has been attended by over 60 participants thus far.
