SUBJECT: Zoning Text Amendment 18-08, Site Plan Amendment – Solar Collection Systems

PURPOSE: Receive testimony on ZTA 18-08

Zoning Text Amendment (ZTA) 18-08, lead sponsor Councilmember Hucker, was introduced on July 17, 2018. ZTA 18-08 would allow solar collection systems without an amendment to a previously-approved site plan under certain circumstances. On July 12, 2018, Councilmember Hucker sent a memorandum to Councilmembers in support of the ZTA:

Earlier this year, the Council passed our zoning text amendment to expand the use of community solar on residential properties¹....[This is] a follow-up ZTA to encourage commercial property owners to adopt solar by reducing delays and lowering the costs.

ZTA 18-08 accomplishes this goal by exempting accessory use solar projects from the costly and lengthy site plan process. Often, the cost of the site plan process can outweigh the benefits of adding solar panels to a property. This ZTA only applies to properties zoned for commercial, employment, industrial and mixed-use without residential.

I hope you will again help us reach our goal of being carbon-free by 2035 by expanding solar adoption in Montgomery County.²

Under ZTA 18-08, a solar collection system on any pre-existing impervious surface would be allowed without amending a previously-approved site plan. In addition, as an accessory use, solar collection

- initiate a massive global mobilization to restore a safe climate and build a sustainable economy; and
- transform the climate by:
 - o reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 80% by 2027;
 - reaching 100% elimination by 2035; and
 - o initiating large-scale efforts to remove excess carbon from the atmosphere.

systems may also be allowed on sites with non-residential uses without a site plan amendment. In such circumstances, any minimum open space requirements must be retained, excluding the area used for the solar collection system.
