Ai Bo received her MSW from University of Southern California Suzanne Dworak-Peck School of Social Work in 2014 and is currently a Ph.D. Candidate at New York University Silver School of Social Work with an expected graduation date of May 2019. Ai has been selected as the recipient of the GADE 2019 Student Award for Social Work Research. Trained as an intervention researcher, Ai pursues her research in three interrelated areas within the overarching topic of adolescent alcohol use prevention: (a) advancing intervention theories for understanding and preventing adolescent alcohol use, (b) synthesizing empirical evidence of intervention efficacy, and (c) enhancing clinical trial design and evaluation methods. Ai has been productive in disseminating her research in all three areas through publishing in top-tier journals and presentations in national and international conferences. During her doctoral studies, Ai has developed strong methodological and statistical skills with expertise in meta-analysis and structural equation modeling. Ai's teaching interests include quantitative and qualitative research methods, clinical theories, and systematic review and meta-analysis.
