“Cancer Survivorship: Improving Outcomes with Social Work Research”

Matthew Moore, Ph.D. is a postdoctoral fellow and lecturer at the University of Tennessee’s Center for Behavioral Health Research and College of Social Work. He holds a doctorate and master’s degree in social work and a master’s degree in statistics. His research is focused on reducing health disparities and improving the long-term mental and physical health of cancer patients. In particular, this includes scalable interventions to reduce problematic stress following a cancer diagnosis. During his postdoctoral training, Dr. Moore has supervised multiple randomized clinical trials on the delivery and effectiveness of interventions delivered by mobile technology. He was the recipient of a Doctoral Training Grant in Oncology Social Work from the American Cancer Society and remains an active member of their research community. Dr. Moore’s work has been published in leading journals and he has presented at numerous national conferences.
