| Survey Overview

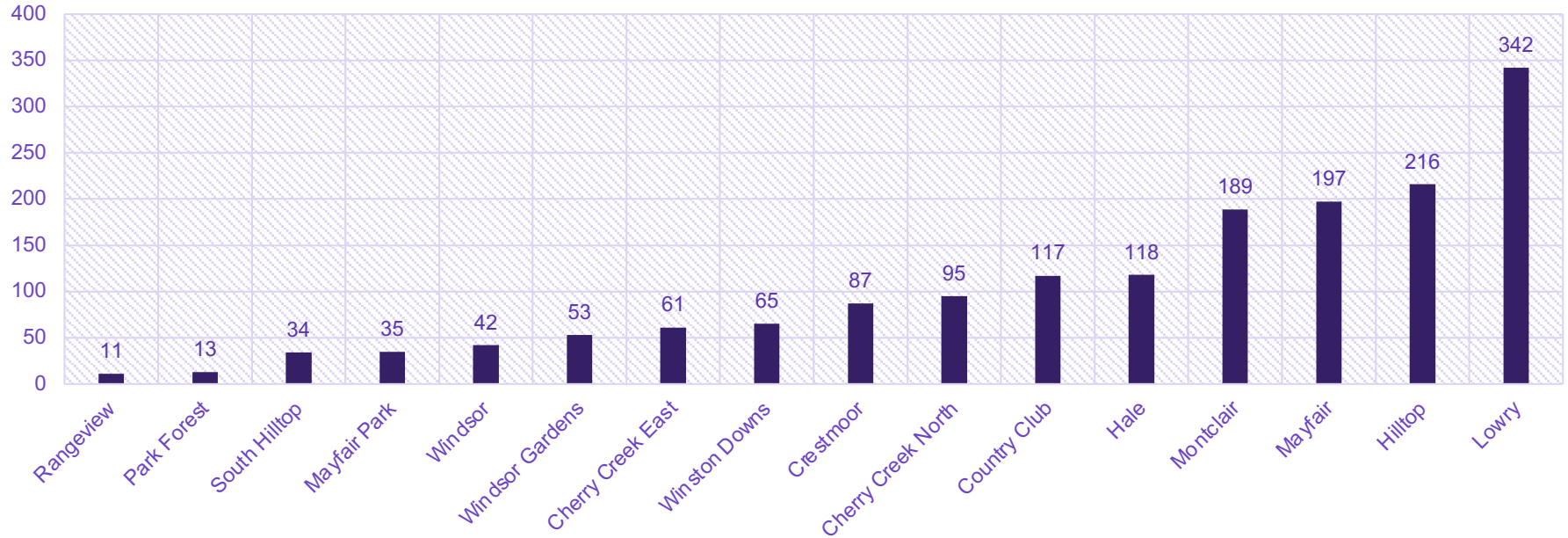
1911 total responses. 1674 responses were considered. 237 excluded for duplication or no answers.

This represents a 30% increase in overall answers and a 33% increase in answers considered in analysis from 2022.

Considering D5 as 65,000 residents, with a confidence level of 95%, district wide results have ~ 2.4% margin of error.

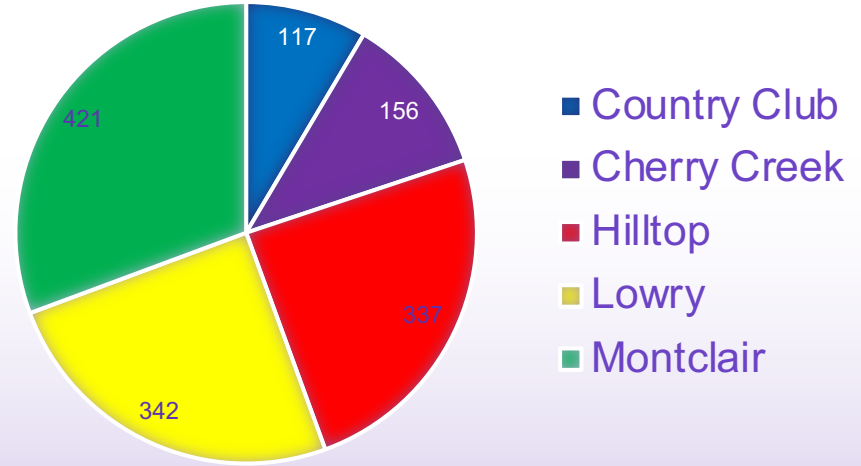
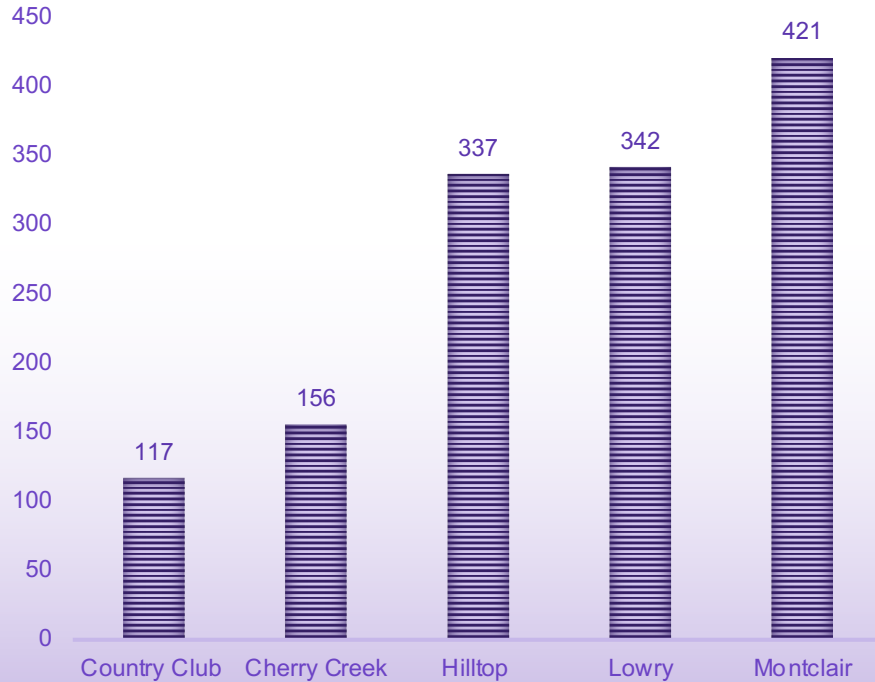

Self Reported Neighborhood





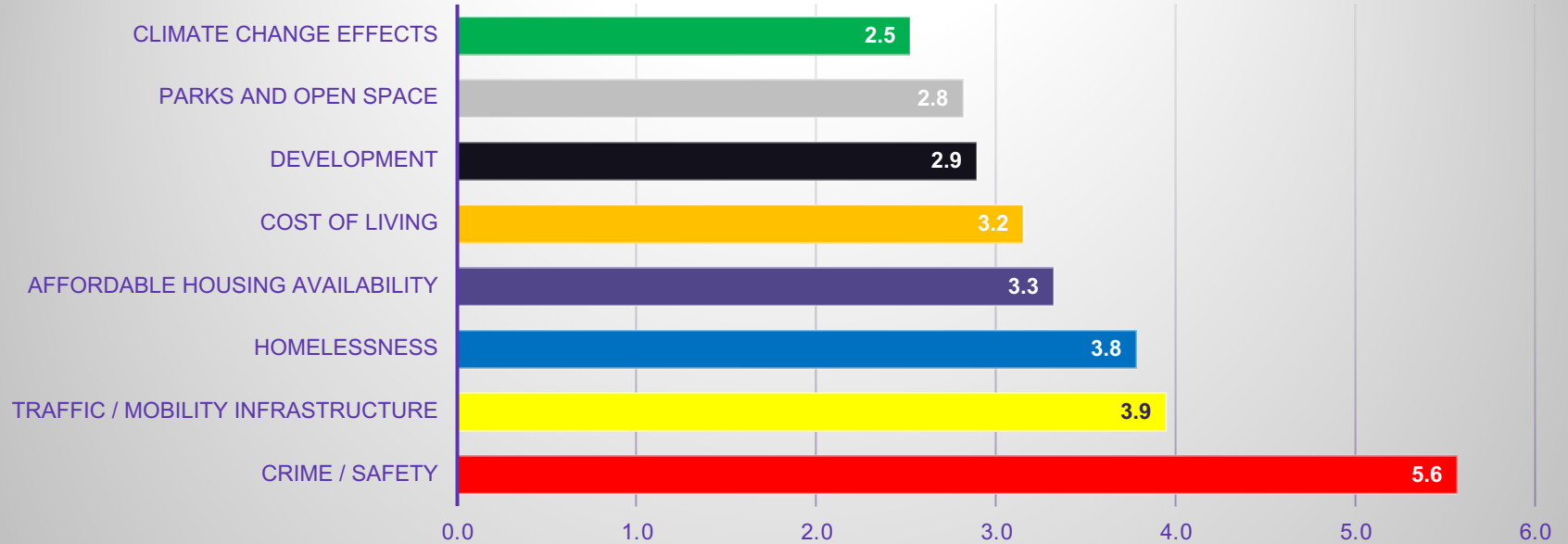

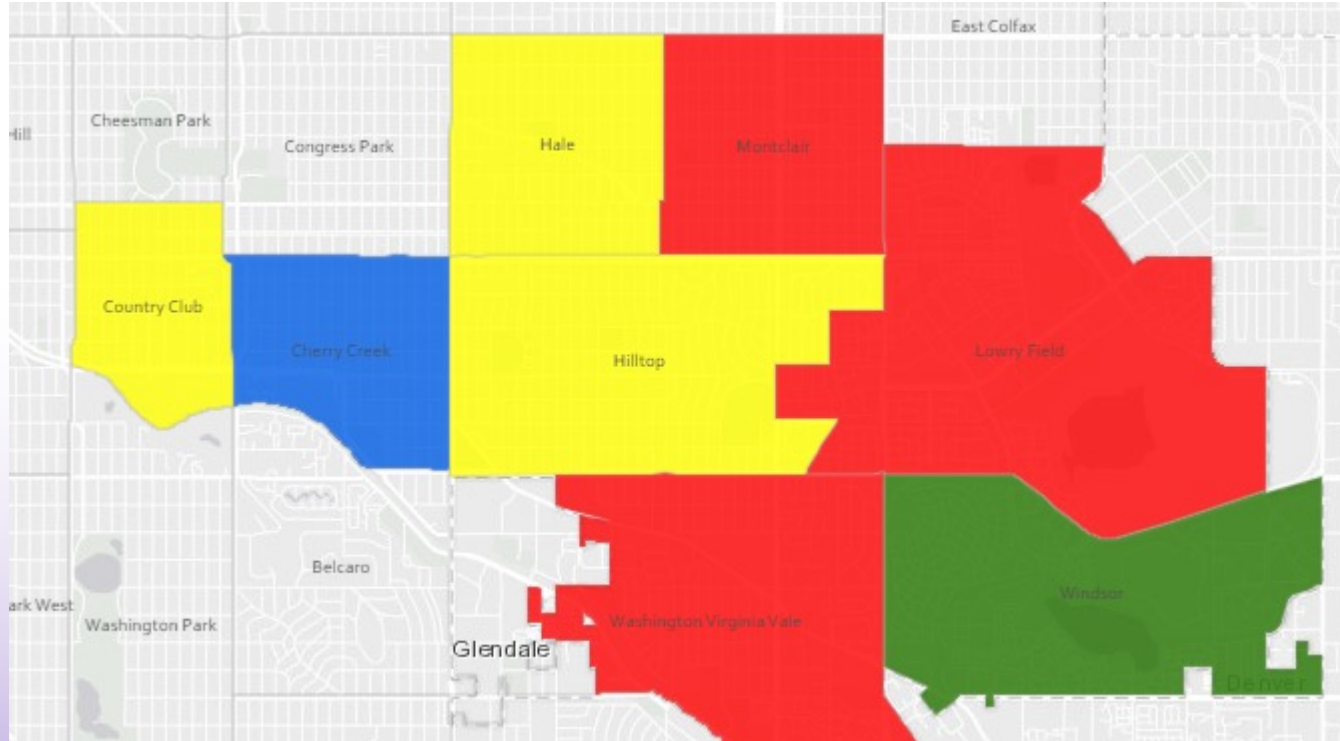

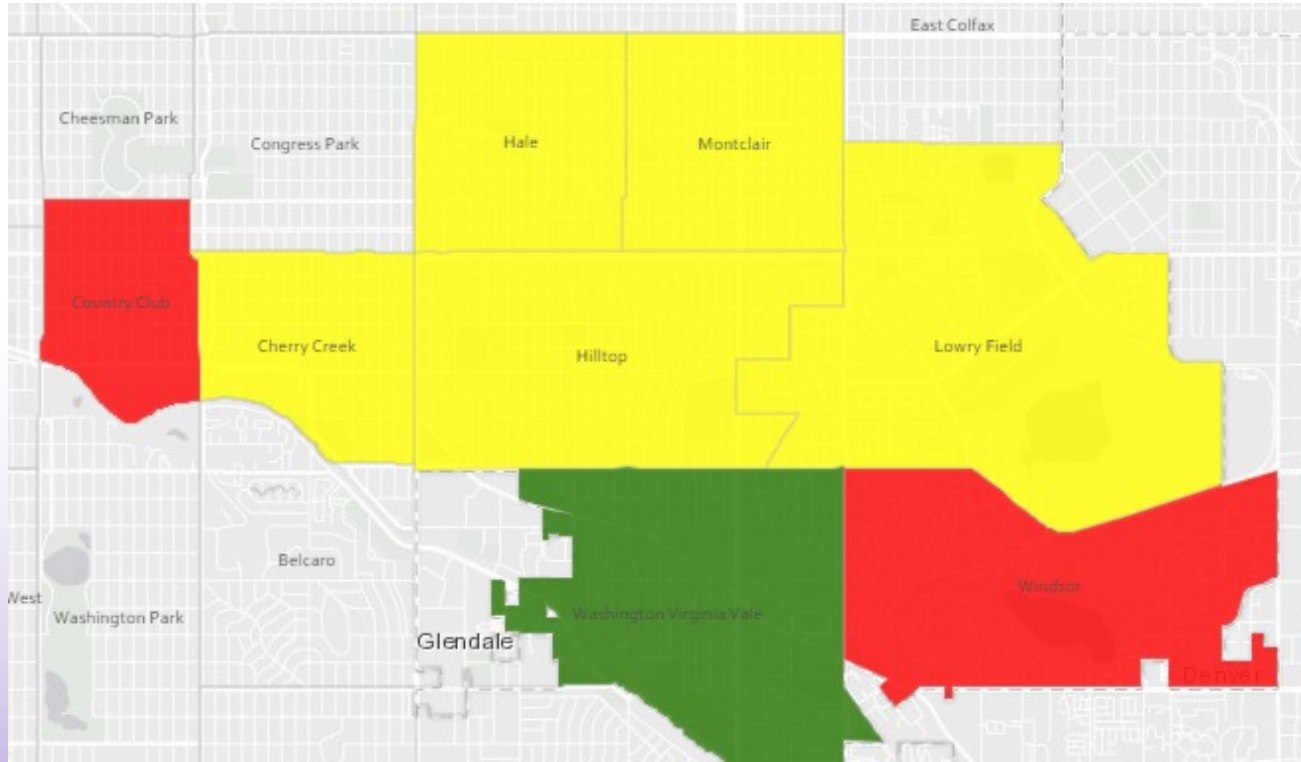

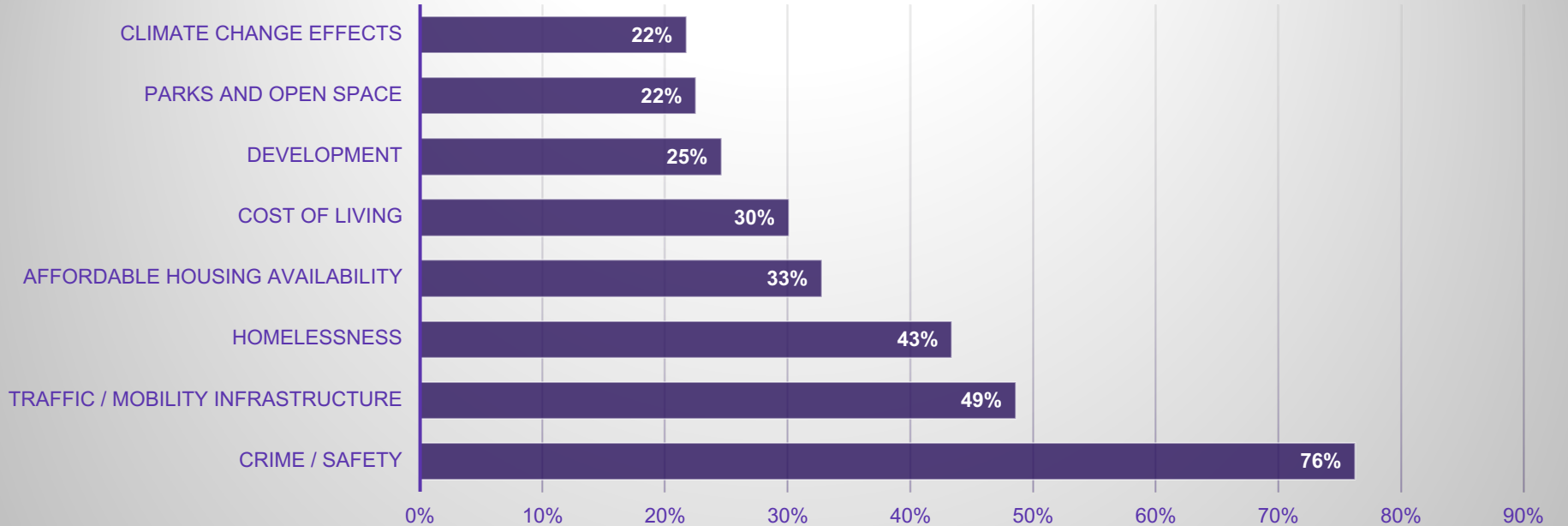

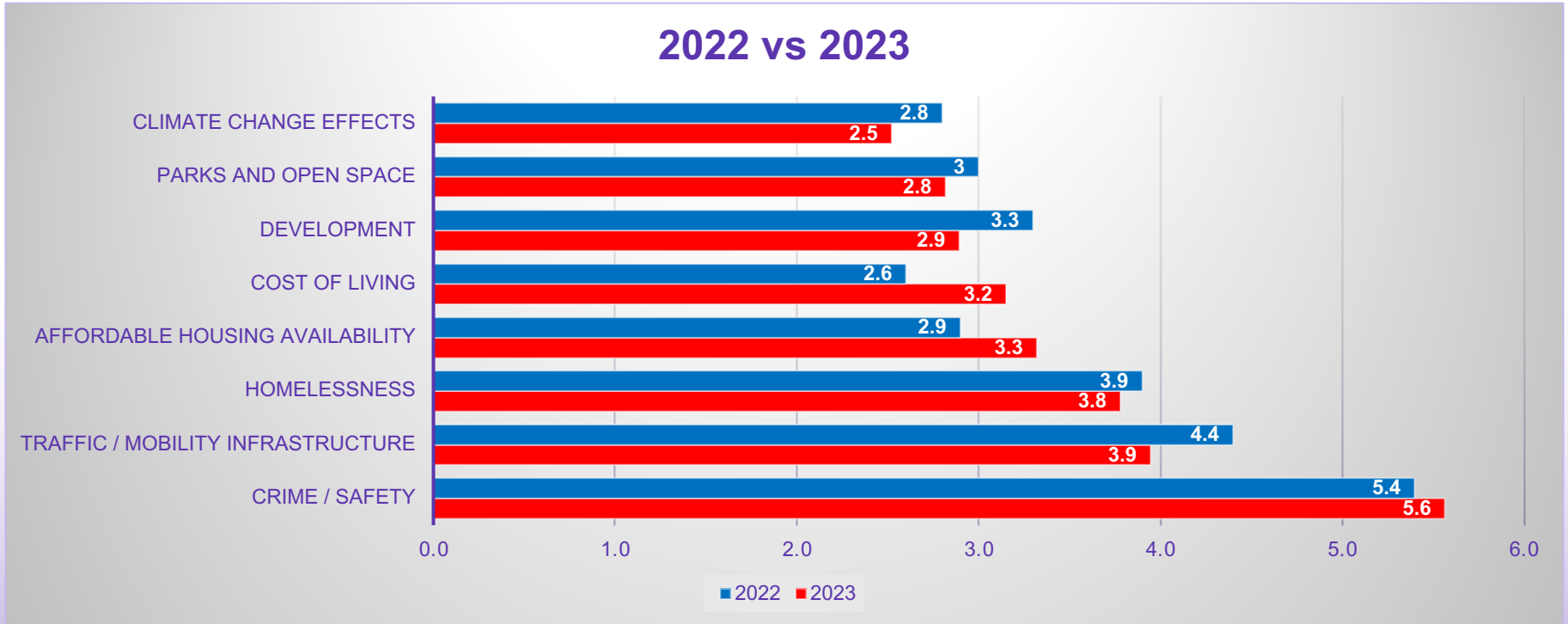

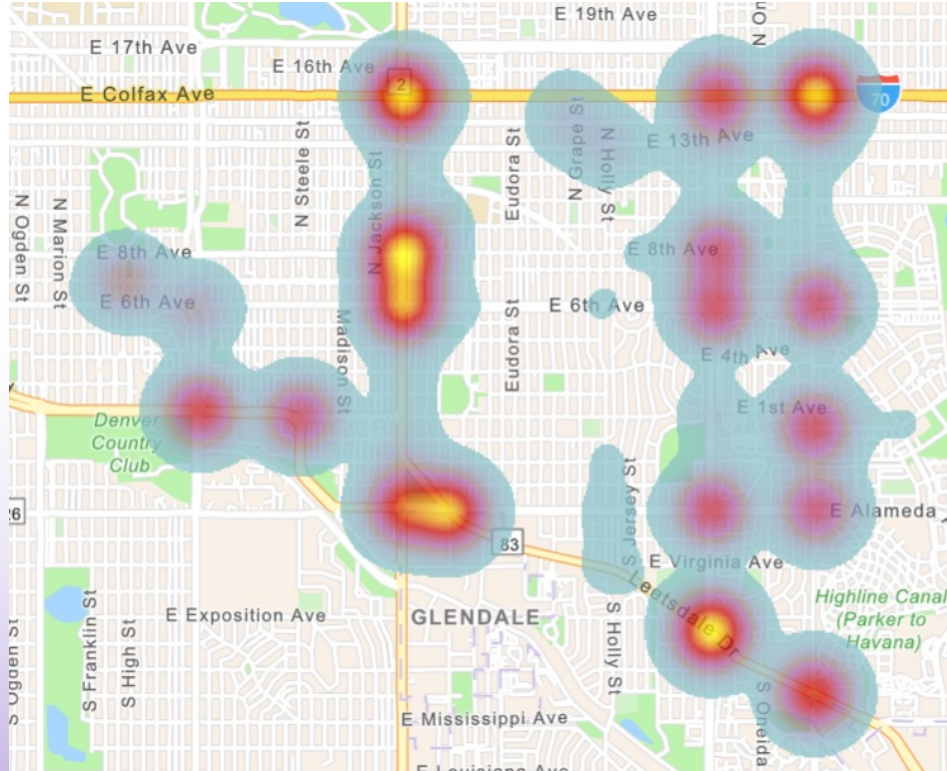
Regression and machine learning efforts showed no statistically significant trends in any of the given categories.

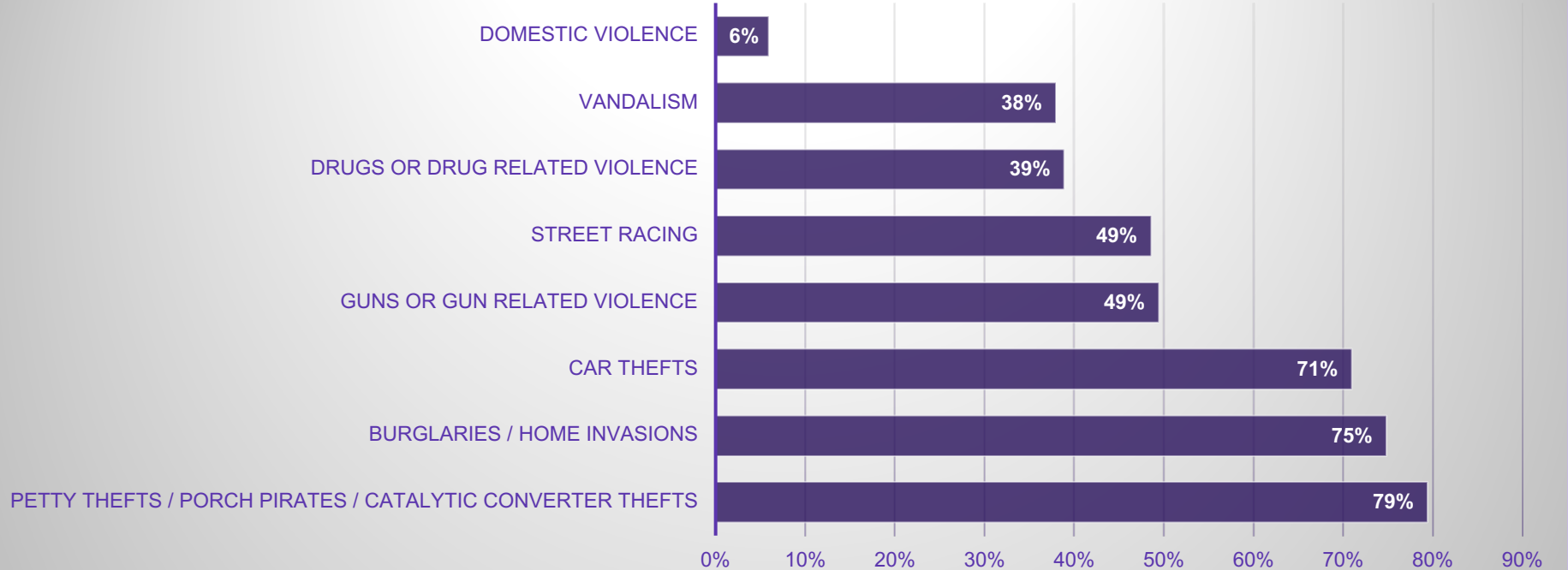
Intersections Map

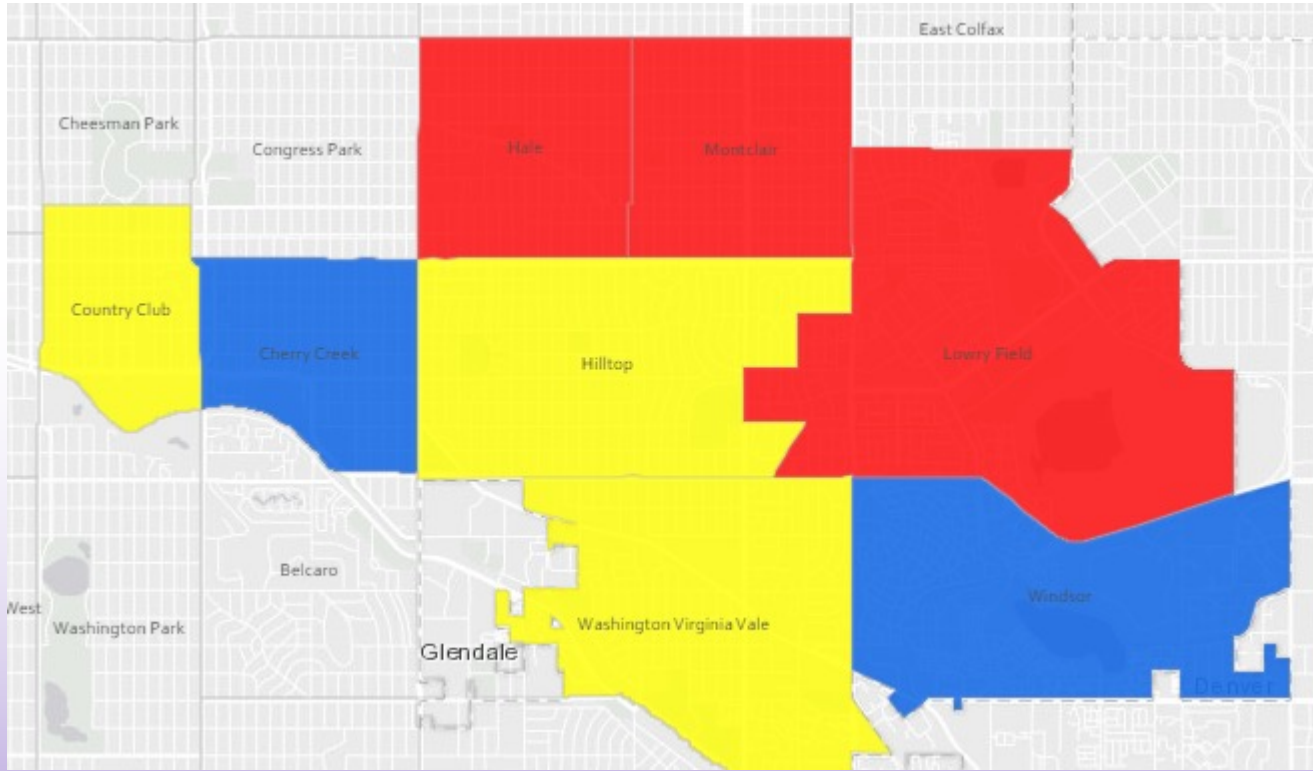

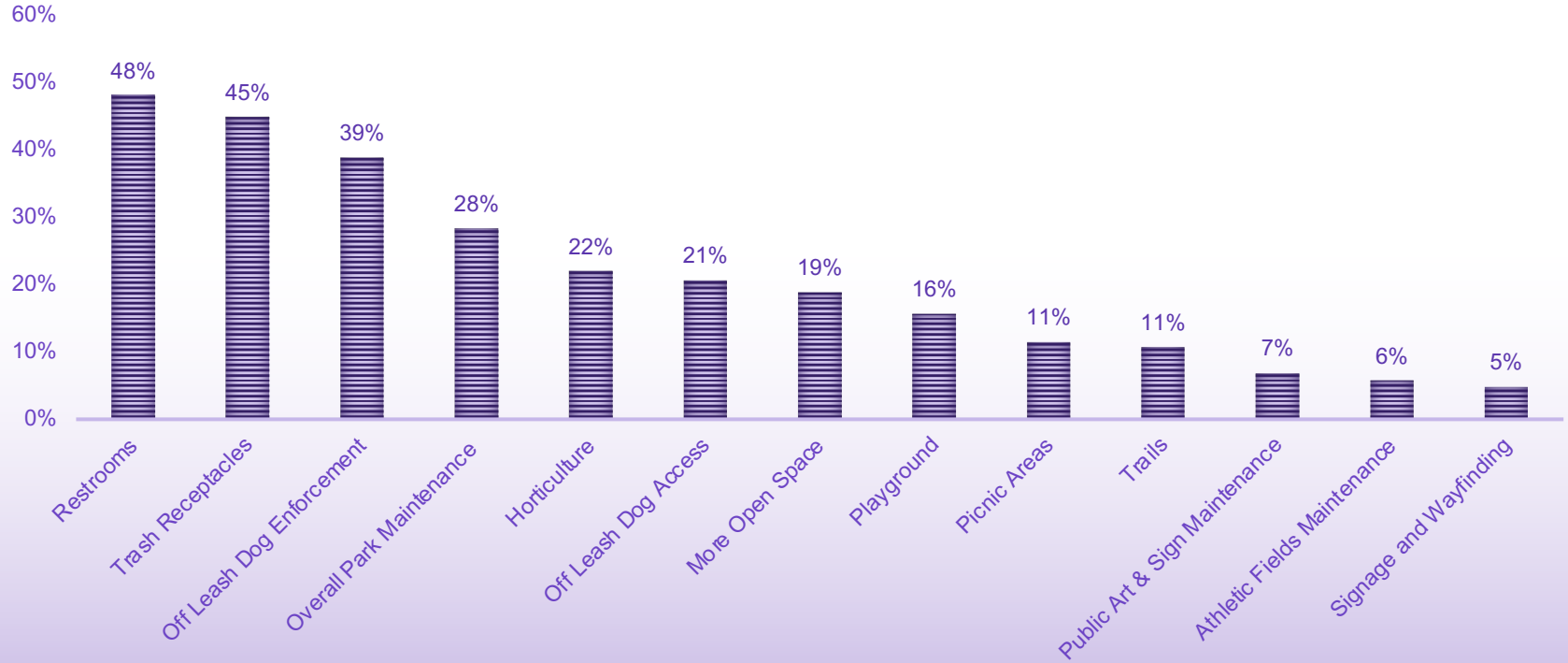

Constituent Services Comments

Positive comments revolved around timely responses, knowledgeable, and able to solve problems.

Negative comments overwhelming revolved around disagreement with your political choices, outcome not to their liking, or inability to address problem.

169 people asked for follow up. 20% (34) said we hadn't responded. 31% (53) left the reason blank. 48% (81) had another issue or a new request.

Conclusions

The perception of crime being worse than it is, is widespread.

While not statistically significant, folks concerned with crime also were worried about homelessness and speed of motorists.

Crime appeared to seep into every category.
