Claire Coyne exhibits an outstanding teaching ability and unselfish, dedicated commitment and service to Santa Ana College. Students regularly comment on her contagious enthusiasm in the classroom. Her unique approach breathes life into the course content: Rocks!

Students share 'they never knew rocks and minerals could be that interesting and exciting!' Her participation in unique programs at SAC is notable. One such opportunity is her 9 seasons committed to the Summer Scholars Transfer Institute (SSTI), an intensive 10-day residential program offered through Santa Ana College University Transfer Center and

held on the University of California, Irvine campus. Her passion in the classroom is clear and obvious, and Claire openly admits to taking her work with her during her vacations. Adrianna Gonzalez has spent the past 15 years teaching within Adult Basic Education programs in the School for Continuing Education at Santa Ana College, and currently serves as Department Chair. Her teaching experience includes high school subjects and Leadership courses, Spanish Literacy, ABE Reading, ABE Writing, CAHSEE, and Critical Thinking. Adrianna's passion for teaching, coupled with a dedication to her department can be illustrated in the enormous departmental growth experienced during the Covid-19 crisis, where she saw enrollments jump 400%!

ALYSSA BEACH
Adjunct Professor, Geology/Earth Science

Alyssa Beach views Santa Ana College as more than a workplace. As an alumna, the SAC community has become a vital element of her identity. As a freshman, she founded the Earth and Space Science Club (1999-2001) as a way to meld her love for the outdoors with her natural curiosity for the sciences. Since then, Alyssa worked for a decade as a professional geologist in the environmental consulting industry before deciding to pursue her dream career of teaching. She graduated from California State University, Fullerton with a Masters of Science in Geology in 2016 and began working as an Adjunct Professor of Geology and Earth

Science at Santa Ana College in 2017. In 2019, she added classes at both Santiago Canyon College and California State University, Fullerton and is thrilled to now be teaching at all three campuses she attended as a student.

Besides teaching, Alyssa currently volunteers as a virtual presenter with Nepris, a nation-wide organization that aims to virtually connect STEM professionals with K-12 classrooms. She looks forward to being able to continue working on other student enrichment projects and volunteer work that have been put on hold due to COVID-19. One such project is a volunteer research program she established for RSCCD students at the John D. Cooper Paleontological and Archeological Center (The Cooper Center), located in Santa Ana. The Cooper Center houses much of Orange County's unique fossil record, worldrenowned as one of the most complete assemblages of Mesozoic-age species. Guided by mentors such as herself, students gain hands-on experience working on scientific investigations to better understand the geologic history of Orange County and the animals who lived here well before the arrival of humans.

This October, Alyssa has been invited to virtually attend the Climate Reality Leadership Corps training alongside former Vice President Al Gore, an honor which will be pivotal to her work, as both a geologist and educator. As an educator, Alyssa strongly believes in addressing the disparities between science literacy and science denialism, specifically about the ongoing climate crisis. She works diligently to interweave the concepts of scientific inquiry, natural processes, and anthropogenic effects into each lesson to ensure her students emerge as accountable citizen scientists.

SONG HONG

Adjunct Professor,

English as a Second Language (ESL)

Song Hong earned a bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the University of California, Berkeley, in 1994 and a master's degree in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) from Azusa Pacific University in 2012. She has been working as adjunct ESL faculty at Santa Ana College School of Continuing Education for the past four years. With the SAC SCE Online Teaching Certificate (OTC), she is currently teaching a hybrid/online ESL class. The remote instruction has strengthened and expanded Song's ability as an instructor to be flexible and knowledgeable in language teaching and digital literacy. Student equity and accessibility have been her focus in designing and delivering her course in recent years.

Song Hong was one of the writers for the ESL Core Curriculum Toolkit in 2018 and wrote the ESL Canvas Curriculum for Beginning Low and Beginning High levels in summer of 2020. Presently, she is co-writing a Canvas CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) Language Support Course to support ESL students to make a smooth transition to Career Education classes. During the fall semester of 2020, she served as a Community of Practice (CoP) mentor for 12 Beginning High instructors. Along with mentoring instructors through the CoP, she was one of the Remote Instruction Certification (RIC) Intensive Support class instructors for six weeks in fall of 2020. During the RIC class, she had trained and supported 25 instructors from the Division of Continuing Education.

Additionally, SAC SCE has equipped Song to grow and contribute through professional development and training. She participated in the Reading Apprenticeship Community of Practice, a Growth Mindset workshop, and Digital Literacy training for the Career Education Department. Furthermore, she has presented flex workshops at SAC SCE since 2018.

To serve the English language learners and its community, Song Hong has been actively volunteering. She has been an active member of California Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages (CATESOL) since 2016 and has been presenting at their regional and state conferences and workshops since 2018. At present, she is co-chairing the CATESOL Spring Virtual Conference 2021, themed Riding the T.I.D.E.- Transformation. Inclusion. Diversity. Engagement. She is serving as a Board Member at CATESOL in 2020-2021 as an Assistant Chair for the Adult Education level and will be serving as a Chair in 2021-2022.

Assistant Professor
Physical Fitness and Wellness

Hayley Stevens started her tenure at Santa Ana College in 2011, as an adjunct faculty member working in Fire Technology, Wellness, and the Criminal Justice Academies. August 2021 will mark Hayley's second year as the full-time Assistant Professor of Physical Fitness and Wellness for the Criminal Justice Academies department at Santa Ana College. Hayley earned her bachelor's and master's degrees in Kinesiology from California State University, Fullerton. She is a certified strength and conditioning specialist, a licensed Emergency Medical Technician, and has over 13 years of experience in the field. Her background is heavily emphasized in coaching and wellness programming, as she was the wellness coordinator for Manhattan Beach and Glendale Police

Departments as well as the Orange County Transportation Authority. Her passion is teaching, coaching, and mentoring, specifically in the areas of health and wellness. She is grateful for the opportunity to share her knowledge, especially with the next generation of peace officers. Hayley's position is untraditional, when compared to her other full-time faculty colleagues on campus. She works year-round coordinating and instructing all curriculum related to Lifetime Fitness for the: Basic Law Enforcement Academy, Correctional Service Assistant/ Sheriff Special Officer Academy (CSA & SSO), and Correctional Service Officer (COCC) academies in partnership with the Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD). She facilitates standardized, job-specific physical training programs that promote graduation success and also prepare student-recruits for their respective careers. Her instruction uses a holistic approach, centered around providing the knowledge and tools to student-recruits and encourages them to maintain their lifelong wellness. Examples include: physical training program design, correct exercise form, preventive lifestyle behaviors to mitigate disease risk, implementation of a variety of physical training modes, injury prevention techniques, recovery techniques, stress and sleep management techniques, and proper nutrition and hydration.

Hayley feels honored every day to be able to positively impact our future peace officers. She believes their work is critical to the wellbeing of our democratic society, both to protect collective societal tranquility and to ensure individual rights. Her goals are to provide them all the knowledge and tools they need to have long, healthy, productive careers in service to all our communities.

# Creative Expression Award

The Profiles in Excellence Creative Expression Award honors a faculty member whose prose, poetry, audio/video, artistic creations or photography has added to the current body of knowledge in his/her discipline and brought recognition to the institution or resulted in other note-worthy benefits by being published, exhibited, or performed.



BRIAN KEHLENBACH Professor, Music

Brian Kehlenbach is a Professor of Music at Santa Ana College where he teaches music theory, composition, jazz history, and digital music recording. He has served as Chair of the Music Department, Interim Dean of Fine and Performing Arts, Co-Chair of the Facilities Committee, and Co-Chair of the Curriculum and Instruction Council. At the college, he has received the Professional Achievement Award and was also named Distinguished Faculty Lecturer in 1999.

As a professional musician, Brian Kehlenbach is a composer, classical recitalist, and jazz pianist. His original music is a reflection of this diverse background - it is propulsive, rhythmic, and written in an eclectic style where jazz harmonies freely intermingle with

classical forms and contemporary textures. Recent performances of his solo and chamber works have taken place at Carnegie Hall, on the Aries Composers Festival in Fort Collins, Colorado, on RealNewMusic festivals, and in several venues across the country. The Pepperdine University Orchestra recently gave the premiere performance of Three Scenes from Moby Dick, a three-movement concerto for tuba and marimba. Other performances of pieces for larger ensembles include In the Land Beyond, Beyond with the Los Angeles Philharmonic New Music Group, Circumdare with the Charleston Symphony Orchestra, Dance of the 25th Hour with the U.S.C. Contemporary Music Ensemble, and Blue Line with the Divan Consort. His piece Times of Reflection for two pianos and electronics was a winning composition in the Betty Freeman Los Angeles Composer's Competition. His music has been heard on the Los Angeles SCREAM festival, the CalArts Contemporary Music Festival, the Los Angeles John Cage Festival, and the Charleston Piccolo Spoleto Festival. Commissions have come from the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Biola University Youth Theatre, and consortiums of generous musicians from across the country organized by Holben Publishing. Kehlenbach holds Bachelor of Science and Master of Music degrees from the University of Connecticut and a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from the University of Southern California, where he was named outstanding graduate in music theory and composition. His music is published by Cimarron Music Press and Emil Kay Music.

### Innovation Award

The Profiles in Excellence Innovation Award honors a faculty member demonstrating excellence in the development of innovative projects or activities, which support instruction, strengthen counseling and increases awareness of a program.



STEPHANIE CLARK
Associate Professor, Digital Media

Stephanie Clark was instrumental in leading the Guided Pathways campus-wide initiative for the past year and a half. Working with a phenomenal group of dedicated faculty, staff and managers from Students Services, Academic Affairs, noncredit and credit, her notable commitment to Guided Pathways projects include the launch of the Guided Pathways subsite with the Web Redesign team, a promise to prioritize noncredit pathways development, the launch of Success Teams during the COVID-19 crisis, and the launch of the Starfish tool this year to improve communications. Stephanie's other notable work has been in founding the Digital Media department with colleagues Michael Taylor and Michael Dermody. The

merger, a student-focused change leading to positive outcomes in student transitions to college and entry into the workforce was formalized this year, bringing together the programs and faculty from Television & Film, Graphic Arts, Digital Media Arts, Animation and User Experience Design. Stephanie's vision for this future-thinking and innovative department is already coming to fruition, with partnerships at 4 high schools and growing, a partnership with the Small Business Development Council of Southern California at the Digital Media Center, and a recently approved grant for \$240,000 in Perkins funds to support innovative lab improvements for animation and media design. Stephanie's activities have proven her dedication to innovation on our campus.

## Professional Achievement Award

The final Profiles in Excellence Award is the Professional Achievement Award. This award is given in recognition of a faculty whose professional contributions have enriched his/her field of teaching, professional organizations or committees, and generated a significant and positive impact on student success that brings recognition to himself/herself, Santa Ana College or the School of Continuing Education.



CHRIS DUFALA
Assistant Professor, Studio Arts

Born and raised in southern New Jersey, Chris Dufala often tells people he is from Philadelphia. He considers this a more appealing thing to say, and a better way to start a conversation. Chris received his Bachelor of Fine Art in Ceramics from Rowan University in 2001 and his Master of Fine Art in Spatial Arts/Ceramics at San Jose State University in 2004. In 1998 he spent a semester abroad, traveling through Europe and studying sculpture at Northumbria University, New Castle upon Tyne. This experience affected his life in a dramatic fashion, forever changing the way he approached his studies and studio practice.

Chris considers himself a dedicated artist as well as an art educator, trying to give equal attention to both his studio practice and fulltime teaching responsibilities. His artwork is composed of objects that reflect an imitation of reality, primarily focused on trompe-l'oeil

ceramic sculpture and the ceramic monotype. The physical appearance of his work belies their actual ceramic nature, much as the objects they represent belie their waste and convenience. Since 2012, Chris has exhibited work nationally in over 75 group, two-person, and solo exhibitions. Some highlights include: National Council on Education for the Ceramic Arts (NCECA) Concurrent Exhibitions Slice and A View from the West, Zanesville Prize for Contemporary Ceramics, Biennial Southwest, Objectus at Eutectic Gallery, Beyond the Brickyard, Archie Bray Resident Exhibition, Montana Triannual, Wave/Wither and NCECA Featured Artist at Hall/Spassov Gallery.

Chris has also been awarded multiple Artist in Residence opportunities, spending two years at the Archie Bray Foundation in Helena Montana, and six months at The Clay Studio of Missoula and Osage Artists Community. He has most recently been published in Ceramics Monthly, Sculpture Magazine, Ceramics: Art and Perception, and Mastering Hand Building by Sunshine Cobb. He has instructed as faculty, lectured on his ceramic building process, and led visiting artist demonstrations at several institutions including: NCECA, University of Montana, Bowling Green State University, Montana State University Bozeman, State University of New York Fredonia, Buffalo State College and Western Michigan University, to name a few.

Chris currently enjoys working with the fantastic students and faculty of Santa Ana College as an Associate Professor of Studio Arts, teaching all levels of Ceramics, Three-Dimensional Design, and Introductory Drawing. In his spare time, he can be found relaxing with his family, hiking in the mountains, white water rafting, and fixing the studio equipment of the C Building.
